

## Humane Education

**Classroom Visits** 

Our Humane Education team reached 2,190 students during 73 visits to 33 classrooms!

**Youth Outreach** 

Through our on-site programs, our Education Team reached 814 youths ages 6 to 18. Additionally, we reached ~4,500 more youth through other outreach activities and events!

Dogs and Families Served by Good Dog Academy

Launched in May of 2023, our Good Dog Academy served 683 dogs and 918 guardians through on-site training sessions!

Pet VIP Therapy and Visitation Program

270 Pet VIP teams contributed 2,083 hours of visitation during 977 individual visits at 328 facilities impacting 48,934 seniors, adults and children!

New Beginnings Program

Some dogs who come into our care have endured adversity, neglect, or trauma, and these scared pups benefit from extra support to find loving families. Through the support of generous donors, HSSA has established a solution-oriented training initiative in collaboration with selected Department of Corrections (DOC) crew members. This program not only aims to rehabilitate the dogs but also offers the crew members an opportunity for personal growth, fostering a sense of responsibility and accomplishment that carries into their future endeavors.




