Dear Friends,

I am pleased to share your latest **Quarterly Community Impact Report**. These updates highlight the incredible lifesaving work made possible by your support, and I want to share a few of the uplifting stories you have made happen this quarter.

Between January 1 and March 31, 2025, your compassion meant:

- ▶ **70 dogs were safely evacuated from the California Wildfires to Arizona.** With support from Petco Love and Wings of Rescue, HSSA helped lead a lifesaving mission with two other Arizona shelters, welcoming 70 dogs from wildfire-affected areas to our state, with 38 of them going right into HSSA's care. All the dogs received medical attention, enrichment, and love—and 32 have found loving homes!
- ▶ **Seven Lab mix puppies saved from a drainpipe in Sahuarita** were able to get immediate medical care and loving foster homes, so they could grow big and strong enough for their spay or neuter surgeries and adoption.
- ▶ **Hiro, a 7-year-old blind Husky, began his journey to lose 100 pounds** through diet and special workouts, including agility exercises and swimming!
- ▶ **When 5 neonatal kittens needed to be kept warm enough to survive**, they stayed safe and cozy in one of two donated incubators, until volunteer foster parents trained in bottle-feeding could pick them up.

These stories are just a glimpse of the impact you've made. The metrics on the other side of this page show the larger scope of the lives and families touched this quarter. Together, we reunited 36 lost pets with their families, placed 273 pets with loving foster caregivers, and supported 209 dogs through our training programs. Every day, our volunteer dog walkers ensured that dogs in our care received joy and enrichment—completing over 9,100 walks so far in 2025!

Your compassion ensures that we can continue stepping up for animals who need help every day. Thanks to your continued generosity, we've been able keep going above and beyond for pets this year. The 5th Annual March Muttness Competition, which HSSA puts on, saw \$390,000 raised by 39 shelters across the country, with \$46,812 directly to HSSA—our highest total so far!

Every adoption, reunion, and second chance is a step to a happy future for pets and the people who love them.
