

Dear Friends,

I'm excited to share your latest **Quarterly Community Impact Report**. Thanks to your generous support, lives have been changed this quarter, and I'm honored to share a few of the inspiring stories you helped make possible.

But first, I want to acknowledge one of the most significant events this quarter at HSSA: on May 30, we announced a reorganization designed to ensure HSSA's financial stability and alignment with national best practices in animal sheltering. As part of this reorganization, eight positions were eliminated, and four new positions were created. We experienced voluntary attrition after this announcement, as is common, and we worked throughout June to ensure that the pets at HSSA were well-cared for. Most positions have now been hired, and I have greatly enjoyed working alongside these new colleagues.

Between April 1 and June 30, 2025, your generosity meant:

- 395 kittens were able to find foster homes, grow strong, and get adopted. Spring is “kitten season” and this year was no different. Newborn kittens arrived everyday (and sometimes at night!) in need of warmth, medical care, food, and comfort.
- Buttercup, a scared but sweet white and tan Pit Bull, escaped her home in rural Cochise County and was bitten by a rattlesnake. She came to HSSA for anti-venom treatment and care. After a tough and costly healing process, she was spayed and, a week later, reunited with her family!

- The HSSA Pet Pantry saw an uptick in donations, allowing us to continue to serve the community pet families who need extra support during hard times.

These stories are just a glimpse of the impact you've made. The metrics on the other side of this page show the larger scope of the lives and families touched this quarter.

Together with our compassionate supporters, we reunited 35 lost pets with their families, placed 465 pets with loving foster caregivers, and supported 290 dogs through our training programs. Every day, volunteer dog walkers ensured that dogs in our care received joy and enrichment — completing over 17,940 hours so far in 2025 (January to June)!

Your compassion ensures that we can continue stepping up for animals who need help every day. Every adoption, reunion, and second chance is a step to a happy future for pets and the people who love them.
