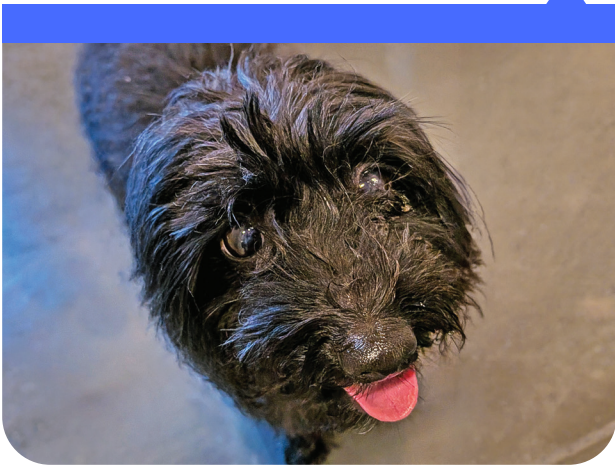

## Dear Friends,

In 2026, your generosity has already brought so much good to southern Arizona's pets and people! We're excited to share the impact you've had in your latest Quarterly Impact Report.

Between January 1 and March 31, 2026, your generosity made these moments possible:

- **Onyx, an 8-year-old terrier mix, found help and a home. She was discovered in a carrier in the parking lot next door, with bite wounds on her body.** The next day, her lung collapsed. But with close medical attention and a loving foster home, Onyx healed. Her foster fell in love with her and took her home for good.



- **We threw a kitten shower to prepare for kitten season!** Guests gifted kitten care supplies like formula and heating discs, learned how to bottle feed neonatal kittens, and played shower games. At the end of the party, we had more than 20 new families sign up to foster. Some of them took home foster pets that day!

- **March Muttiness raised more than \$370,000 for pets in need across the country!** Since 2020, HSSA has hosted this fun, nationwide fundraising competition. This year, we finished second among 51 animal welfare

organizations, bringing home nearly \$80,000 in donations made directly to HSSA. We loved connecting with dedicated colleagues, whether they were on the other side of town or the other side of the country.

With temperatures rising and kitten season in full swing, we expect to see many more pets with urgent medical needs in the coming months. We'll be ready to receive them in Max's MASH Unit, a new in-shelter medical unit which expands our capacity to treat sick and injured pets. We can't wait to share those inspiring stories of recovery with you.
